## BURTON SALMON PARISH COUNCIL

Minutes of the Annual Parish Meeting held on 16<sup>th</sup> May 2019 at 6:30pm in the Village Hall, Main Street, Burton Salmon.

1/19 Present - Cllr Foster, Cllr Tait, Cllr Greene, Cllr Raine, Cllr Edis, Clerk Meir, one parishioner and County Councillor Pearson.

- 2/19 Reports from Councillors -
- **2/19.1 Burial Committee** Cllr Greene is new to the role as a representative on the Burial Committee and Cllr Wroe has passed on all the paperwork to him following his retirement from the Parish Council. Cllr Greene will attend the AGM which will be held on 18<sup>th</sup> June
- **2/19.2 Planning summary** The proposal for a new gas fired power station at Ferrybridge is on-going. Although the proposed route does not go through the Parish, the Council will maintain a watching brief on developments.
- **2/19.3 Financial position** The Parish Council is in a stable financial position with just funds of £ 8,207 carried forward from 2018/19. There are no issues with the budget for 2019/20 subject to the costs of street light replacements.
- 2/19.4. Other matters The village hall has seen a significant rise in its usage, with regular exercise classes and school usage increased. As a result of the increase in income, the Village Hall Trust are now able to make a contribution towards the repayment of the loan. Substantial progress has been made with the renovations, as the new heaters, door, toilets and insulation have been installed. The new kitchen and disabled access are still to be completed.

More first aid training has been delivered for using the defibrillator, with people from other areas of the village attending. Following the retirement of Cllr Wroe, Cllr Greene has taken over as lead for the War Memorial.

At the parish Council elections on 2<sup>nd</sup> May, Cllrs Wroe, Holmes and Anderson, stood down, with the remaining Cllrs re-elected uncontested, along with new Cllr Edis. As a result, there are two vacancies on the Parish Council following the elections.

3/19 Matters raised by parishioners – A parishioner thanked Cllr Tait and District Cllr Mackman for the work they did to resolve the issue about the proposed school gate to allow pupils to access the site from the Beech Grove car park, which is not going ahead. Problems with parking at the school continue are parents are parking on the new yellow lines.

The parishioner also reported that she has contacted the Neighbourhood Officer from Selby District Council about the pot holes on Beech Grove.
